
While we want to help as much as we can, our photographers must focus on what they do best - taking amazing pictures! Please make sure your house is fully prepared BEFORE the photographer gets there. Here is a checklist to help you get everything ready for your photo shoot!

Outside

Ramp up that curb appeal!



- Put garbage bins inside the garage
- Wind up garden hoses
- 0 Remove all toys from yard- put in garage
- 0 Open umbrella on the patio
- Remove cover from grill- place cover in garage.
- Put dog kennel in garage 0
- Pick up dog poop please!:)

Living Room A place to impress your guests!

Remove all items from shelving & surface areas like co	ffee
tables, end tables, bookshelves, etc. Some examples a	re:

- 0 remote controls
- 0 newspapers, magazines, etc.
- decorative knick knacks

Also remove...

- dog/cat beds 0
- 0 garbage bins
- 0 any personal artwork/photos hanging on the walls
- 0 make sure all lamps are on & functional
- 0 hide electrical cords as much as possible
- 0 vacuum & clean clean clean!
- 0 potentially add a centerpeice to tabletops






Kitchen The heart of the home



- Remove all appliances & clutter from countertops
- 0 Clean appliances
- Remove the following:
 - magnets from refrigerator
 - hand towels from oven & fridge 0
 - candles from stove
 - pots/pans/tea pots from stove
 - dirty dishes from the sink
 - all sink drainplugs and dishrags

Bathrooms and Laundry Rooms Necessary for any living space, and the cleaner the better!

- Get rid of all products in the shower & sink
- 0 Remove garbage bin
- 0 Put nice bath towels out
- Remove clothes from front loading washing machine & dryer
- Remove all washing/cleaning products 0
- 0 Clean bathroom mirrors/countertops
- Put the toilet seat down in all bathrooms





Bedrooms


Pretend this is a destination hotel, how would you want it to look?



- O Declutter and remove all items from vanity, bedside tables, dressers, etc.
- O Clean and smooth out bedding
- O Clean closet
- Place one or two decorative items on the dressers



Finishing Touches Sometimes its the little things that matter the most!



Before your photographer arrives:

- Turn on all lights 0
- 0 Add simple centerpieces to tables
- Close all windows/ Open all blinds
- 0 Arrange rooms to show how they are best used
- Turn off fireplaces (we can add a fire later) 0
- 0 Turn off tv screens (we can add a nice look later)
- Turn off ceiling fans

Simple = Sells!

Dont Forget! Last but not least!

- Have kids stay at Grandma's 0
- 0 Remove pets from the property or keep them inside a room not being photographed
- Park cars out of sight or in the garage
- Be sure to tuck away pet toys, food dishes, etc.
- Try putting extra things in the garage or closets
- 0 Make sure there aren't any appointments for land scaping, yard work, painting, etc. scheduled for the day of your shoot

"Hiding" things on one side of the bed or in the corner may not be good enough!



Why all this hard work!? I will just wait for the photographer to get here and help out!



Staging your home for a photo shoot is a lot of hard work! We promise it will be worth it. There are tons of things to do and think about!

Lets look at the photo to the left for some examples of things that should be removed.

All of the circled items really need to be removed before the photographer arrives! Why?

Lets break it down:

-If the towel on the oven is removed, that will draw attention away from the towel to the clutter on the counter.

-If the clutter on the counter is cleaned up that will draw attention to the clutter on top of the fridge.

-If that clutter is cleaned, the next pile will become the focus of attention.

If the photographer is the one doing the cleaning, eventually the whole place will be immaculate, but they may be late to their next shoot!
